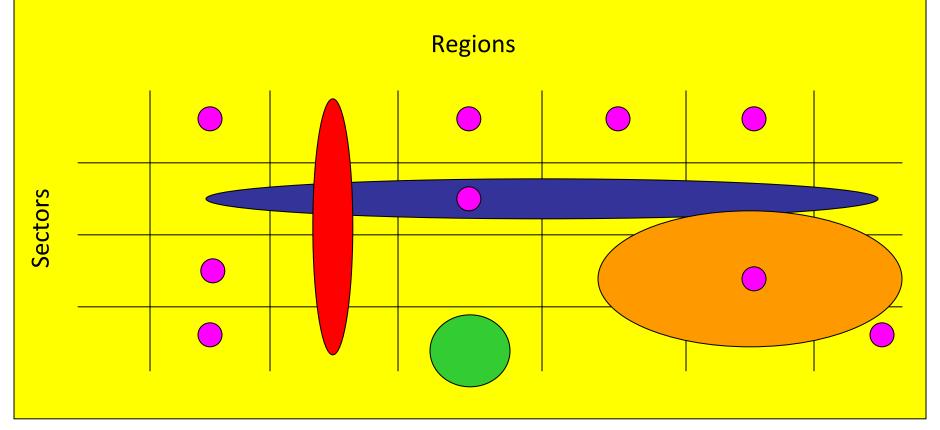

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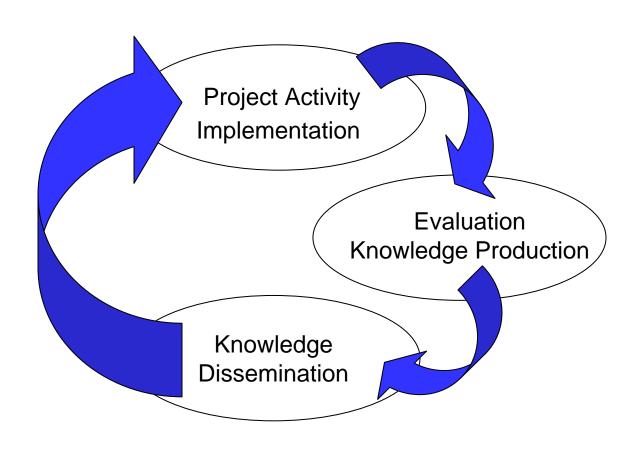

Change of Paradigm 2005

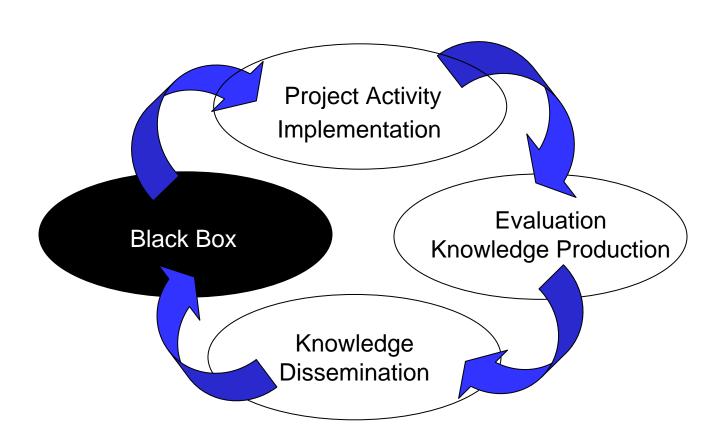
OED: Providing an objective assessment of the results of the WBG work – *Accountability* (looking backwards)

IEG: and to improve result in the future - *Learning* (looking forward)

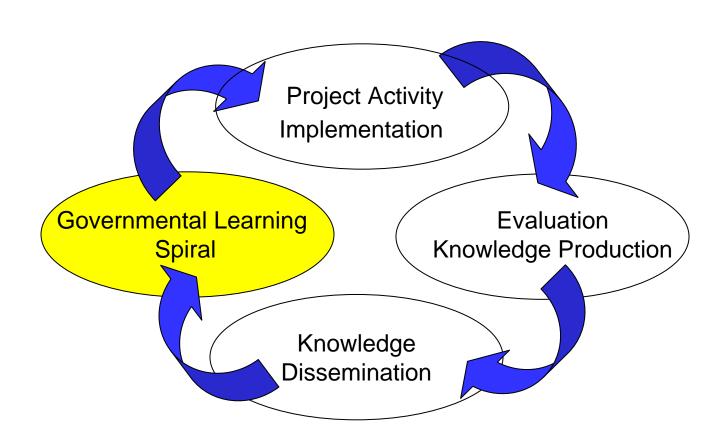

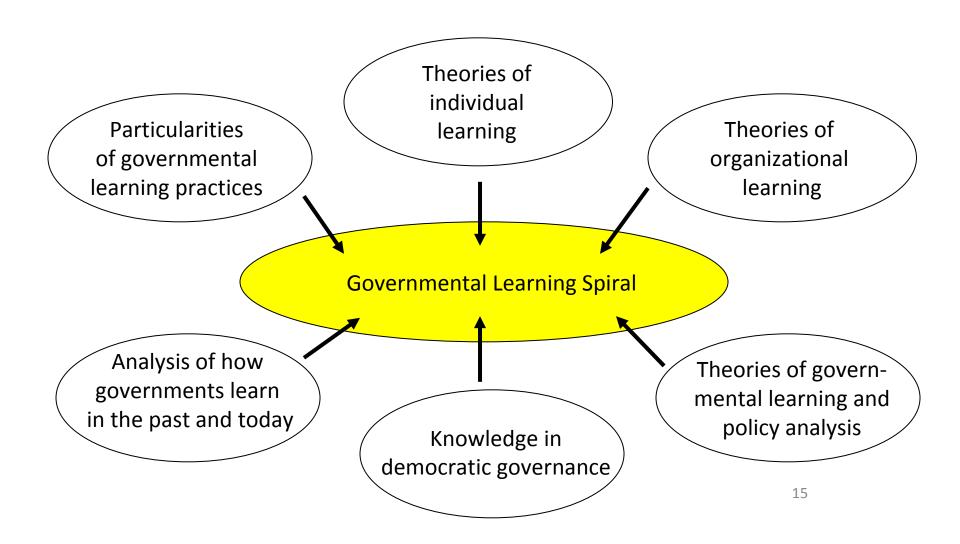

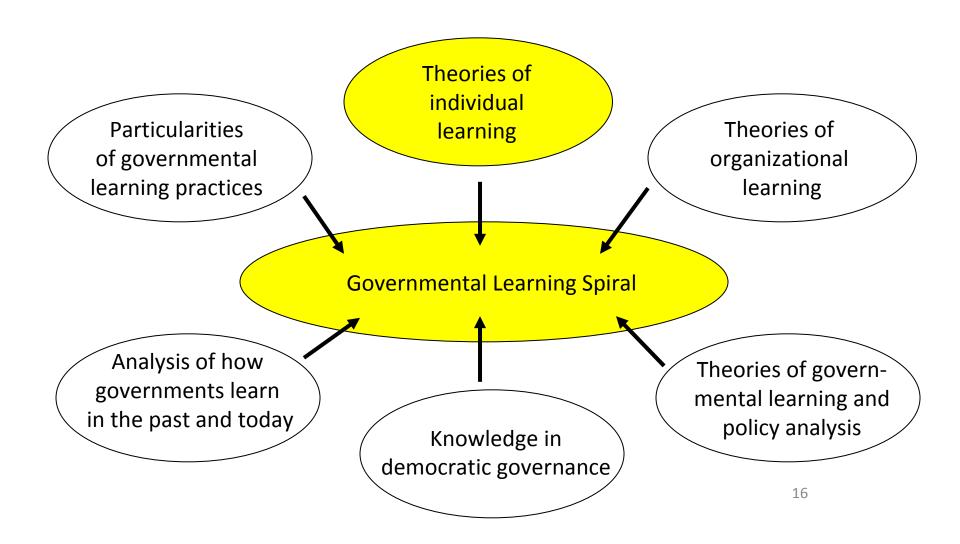

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5. Template "Governmental Learning Spiral"



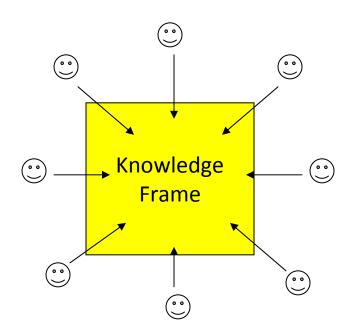
Stage 1: Conceptualization

Stage 2: Triangulation

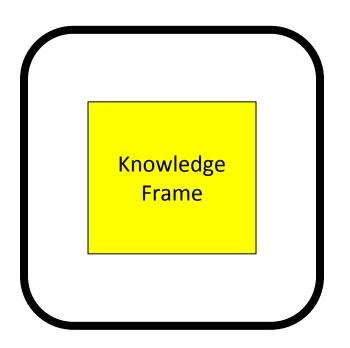
- Content triangulation

Stage 3: Accommodation

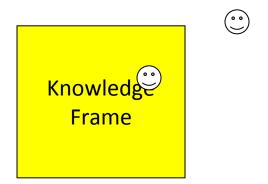
- Creation of a learning space

Stage 4: Internalization

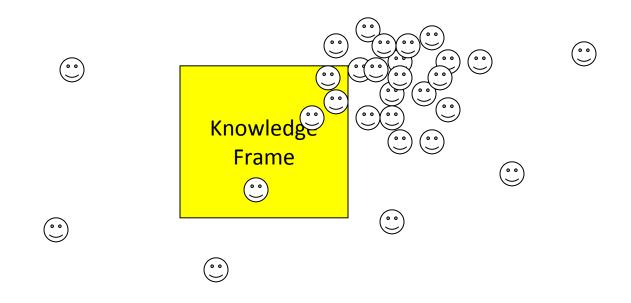
- Space for self-reflection
- Validation of individual reality (deduction)





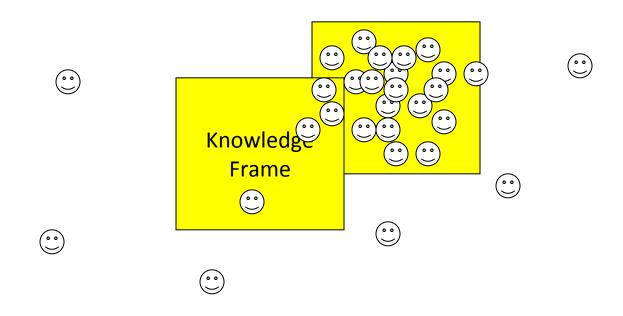
Stage 5: Externalization

- Validation of collective reality



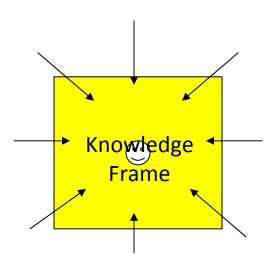
Stage 6: Reconceptualization

- Updating and reframing knowledge (induction)



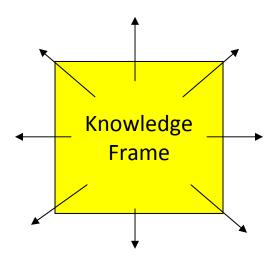
Stage 7: Transformation

 - Planning implementation (deduction)



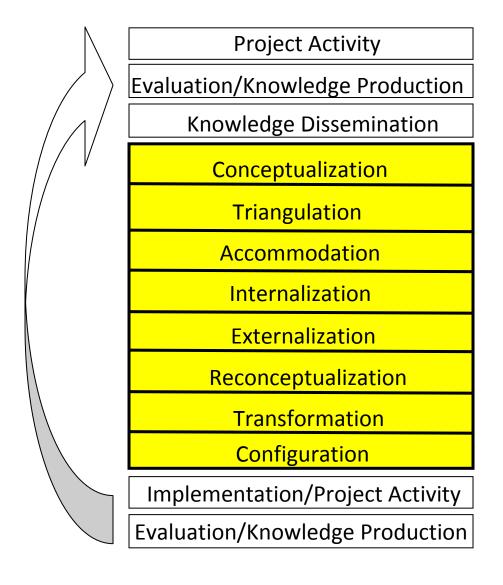
Stage 8: Configuration

 - Sustainability of learning process



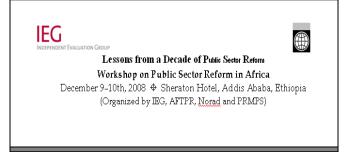


5. Template: "Governmental Learning Spiral" System

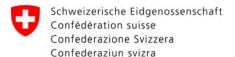
